1. Chords and Symbols

Chord Symbols - Triads

There are five general types of triads. A key letter by itself indicates a major triad though a suffix may be added. The others require additions to the key letter as follows:

Major	C, CM, CMa, CMaj
Minor	C-, Cm, Cmi, Cmin
Augmented	Caug, C+, C+5
Diminished	Cdim, Co
Suspended	Csus, Csus4



Chord Symbols - 6th Chords

Major 6 th	C6, CM6, CMa6, CMaj6
Minor 6 th C-6, Cm6, Cmi6, Cmin	



Chord Symbols - 7th Chords

Major 7 th	C∆, CM7, CMa7, CMaj7
Dominant 7 th	C7
Minor 7 th	C-7, Cm7, Cmi7, Cmin7
Minor 7 th , b5	CØ, Cm7-5, Cm7b5
Diminished 7 th	Co7, Cdim7
